BOOK SYNOPSIS

It's 1997 and young Amy Rose has always known that something is off about her community. She's forbidden from going to school or even going outside; after all, their leader says there's no use knowing anything about a world that's about to end. When the Hale-Bopp comet soars across the sky for the first time in over 4,000 years, Amy thinks it's a good omen signaling the start of an amazing new future. Instead, it brings news of a horrible tragedy at a similar compound just down the road called Heaven's Gate. Televised news reports invade the temple walls and Amy hears a new word that suddenly explains everything: cult.

Now, she must risk everything to indulge in secret trips to an abandoned off-limits library to learn what she was never meant to know: that Gandhi was not a space alien, that Star Trek wasn't real, that her community was built on a lie, and most importantly, that banned books can give her everything she needs to escape.

RESPONSE TO CHALLENGES

The book has been challenged numerous times across Texas, with most districts determining that the book is safe for schools. Only one school district automatically removed the book as part of a list of 676 books without reading any of them.

The Texas Freedom to Read Project stated that the book's themes of freedom were likely the reason book banners were targeting the book. The group posted "they don't want young people to experience those ideas and come to conclusions on their own."

The Florida Freedom to Read Project distributed 50 copies of Occulted to local schools and libraries.

AUTHOR STATEMENT

Occulted was not an easy book to write. The real life traumas that Amy experienced are not easy to discuss. But her story proves that there are kids who survive difficult and traumatic experiences. But learning about how to escape dangerous situations is how young people survive. Difficult books are what saved Amy's life, so we hope that our book will save the life of another kid.
