In David Levithan's New York Times bestseller *Every Day*, readers met A, a teen who wakes up every morning in a different body. A has made peace with that, even established guidelines by which to live: Never get too attached. Avoid being noticed. Do not interfere. It's all fine until the morning that A wakes up in the body of Justin and meets Justin's girlfriend, Rhiannon, and discovers what it means to want to be with someone—day in, day out, day after day.

In *Another Day*, readers experience the same story from Rhiannon's perspective, as she seeks to understand A's life and discover if you can truly love someone who is destined to change every day.
